Tariffs on DMEPOS

During the early months of his presidency, President Donald Trump implemented tariffs on certain countries. Many manufacturers in durable medical equipment, prosthetics, orthotics, and supplies (DMEPOS) industry source their stock from these countries, prompting the industry to closely monitor the situation to determine whether any exclusions might apply to medical equipment and products.

An increase in tariffs could lead to several key impacts:

- Increased Wholesale Costs: The cost of importing medical equipment from overseas
 will rise, impacting on the overall expenses for DMEPOS providers. This increase in
 costs is likely to be passed on to consumers, leading to higher prices for medical

- Exploring Alternative Supply Sources: Identify and establish relationships with new suppliers who are not affected by the tariffs.
- **Increasing Inventory Levels:** Stockpile essential medical supplies to buffer against potential shortages and delays.
- Advocating For Policy Changes: Engage with policymakers to advocate for measures
 that mitigate the impact of tariffs on essential medical supplies.
